1. Call to order

Mayor Eccles called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

2. Moment of reflection

Mayor Eccles called for a moment of reflection.

3. Declarations of pecuniary interest and general nature thereof

3.1 Councillor Foerster - Neustadt-Normanby-Carrick Agricultural Society - Request for financial donation

Councillor Foerster declared a conflict with agenda item 10.1.2 regarding correspondence from the Neustadt-Normanby-Carrick Agricultural Society-Request for financial donation as he is a member and the current president.

3.2 Deputy Mayor Hutchinson - Delegation - Karen Cox - South Grey Chamber of Commerce

Deputy Mayor Hutchinson declared a conflict with agenda item 4.4 regarding the delegation from Karen Cox – South Grey Chamber of Commerce as he is the current vice-president of the Chamber of Commerce.

Staff reviewed instructions for members of the public to participate via Zoom, and how to contact staff for assistance if disconnected.

Councillor Shea joined the council meeting at this time.

4. Delegations/presentations

4.1 Delegation - Clark Little - Ontario Pumped Storage-TC Energy

Clark Little, TC Energy, provided a deputation on the Ontario Pumped Storage project located in Meaford.

Mr. Little provided an overview of the project emphasizing that it is for the storage of electricity, but not a producer of power. The power is transported underwater and underground and once it reaches land, it connects to existing towers to service Ontario. The pumped storage facility is designed to protect fish, water, and the Niagara Escarpment.

Currently the project is at the environmental impact assessment stage with an anticipated 4.5-year construction period after the completion of the environmental assessment. Operations are anticipated to begin in 2030. Lastly, Mr. Little noted that this is a Made-In-Ontario project with a major economic development opportunity.

4.2 Delegation - Amy Moyes - Big Bites Food Truck

Amy Moyes, owner of Big Bites Food Truck, provided a deputation asking for council to consider a bylaw amendment for mobile food premises. Ms. Moyes advised that she and her husband started their food truck business in January 2020 and are currently located at the Durham Car Wash. Ms. Moyes advised each year they pay \$300.00 for a West Grey permit and would like to move around the community to events without having to do an amendment and pay an additional fee. Ms. Moyes noted that in 2022 they participated in the Family Day celebration, Ayton ball tournament, and wanted to join the Durham Homecoming celebration but the additional fee and amendment requirement discouraged them.

The Director of Development/CBO joined the meeting at this time.

4.3 Delegation - Brian Carr - Special Olympics-Ontario South Saugeen

Brian Carr, Special Olympics-Ontario South Saugeen provided a deputation asking for council to approve free storage of their mats and free ice time at the Normanby Arena for the Special Olympics Ontario South Saugeen.

The presentation highlighted the proposal of a memorandum of understanding with four municipalities consisting of West Grey, Grey Highlands, Southgate, and Chatsworth. Ms. Cox noted the deliverables in 2023 consisting of: Tourism Support, Business and Community Events. The South Grey Chamber of Commerce is requesting \$10,000 from each municipality which will provide the Chamber a foundation to deliver and create the events and services outlined in the proposal while continuing to provide enhanced services and expanded events for 2023.

Deputy Mayor Hutchinson returned to his chair.

The Interim Director of Infrastructure and Public Works advised that a significant weather event is expected this Friday and Saturday where public travel is being advised against.
