4.1 2021 Municipal Budget

Director Mighton provided an overview of the 2021 budget, reviewing expenditures, revenues and significant capital projects. The 2021 West Grey tax levy increase is 5.4%, being \$554,856 which will result in an increase of \$32 per \$100,000 of assessment for a residential home.

Director Mighton reviewed all budget related comments and questions received via the website survey, noting that six people participated. She advised that any operational concerns received have been forwarded to the appropriate department.

Councillor Townsend gave notice of a motion for the next regular agenda to request that a staff report be provided to a future meeting, prior to year-end and prior to 2022 budget deliberations regarding how year-end surpluses are addressed.

Planner responded to questions noting that minister's order are generally used in northern Ontario where there are no zoning bylaws or for infrastructure such as internet fibre installation, it is for provincial initiatives not for supporting individual land owners. The comment period for the environmental registry closed April 30, 2021. She noted it has not historically been used in West Grey as we have planning processes in place.

- a. which are limited to addressing an extraordinary and emergent circumstance that is a matter of provincial interest,
- which are limited to measures which the Municipality of West Grey could not otherwise bring into force in time to adequately address the relevant extraordinary and emergent circumstance,
- c. which are consistent with the Official Plan, Provincial Policy Statement, 2020, and Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe and s. s. 24, s. 2, s. 3 of the Planning Act,
- d. which do not authorize urbanization outside of settlement area boundaries,
- e. which do not authorize development that would destroy or displace a Provincially Significant Wetland, Provincially Significant Woodland, Provincially Significant Valley Lands, Provincially Significant Wildlife Habitat, Coastal Wetlands, Areas of Natural and Scientific Interest or farmland,
- f. which are framed geographically or in their wording so as to not to limit any power that a Conservation Authority would otherwise have, and

- g. which are supported by the Minister's comprehensive, written, and publicly-disclosed reasons for determining that the above criteria have been met.
- whose issuance is expressly requested through a lawfully adopted motion of the municipal government(s) to whose territory the Order pertains; and

Further that this resolution be sent to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, the Premier of Ontario, MPP Walker and Ontario municipalities.
