In any case, about two years ago now he began a campaign to clean up our community. He started by taking a large bag out on walks and filling it up with whatever he saw on the side of the road. He then will bring the bags back to our home, divide up the garbage and recycling for disposal and arrange to have the beer cans/bottles returned for deposit - which he then deposits in his bank account.
