Recommendation

THAT council receive the West Grey Parks and Gardens Plan for information; and

THAT council authorize staff to proceed with the Parks and Garden Plan for 2021 recognizing a potential budget variance to complete the plan.

Executive summary

Staff has completed a review of West Grey parks, gardens, and greenspaces throughout the urban centers of the municipality and developed a parks and garden plan to address the various issues identified.

Background and discussion

In addition to community volunteers, the former parks committee of council, which was dissolved in 2018, managed West Grey parks and gardens. Currently, small groups of dedicated volunteers in each community coupled with a small team of staff have been tending to flower beds and gardens.

In preparation for the 2021 beatification season, and looking further toward the 2022 Durham homecoming, staff completed a review of the parks and garden inventory and identified many shortfalls.

Several budget lines are allocated parks and beautification. The economic development budget has \$25,000 for 2021 commercial beautification projects. The parks budget funds summer staff wages, water and materials expenses for all other parks. The 2021 budget was presented to council as a status quo budget, given other significant budget pressures this year. However, this parks plan and schedule was developed as a proactive measure and in conjunction with recent community and volunteer feedback.



In order to restore the parks and gardens that were previously maintained by volunteers, the following plan has been prepared. Budget shortfalls will be reported as a variance in the Parks 2022 budget presentation.


2021 Parks Plan:

- 1. Train existing students and staff regarding what is needed for the gardens and how to maintain them. (ongoing)
- 2. Inventory, prioritize and create project/work plan for existing municipal flower and vegetable gardens in West Grey. (completed)
- 3. Monitor the outcomes of the 2021 season and identify improvements for future seasons. Make recommendations for parks and garden status moving forward
- 4. Prepare a parks operating and capital budget for 2022
- 5. Continue with the existing internal and contracted grass cutting programs

Flower Garden Priority / Work Plan for 2021

Priority level (high, medium, normal) outlines the order in which the gardens / parks will be addressed. Priority levels were established through community and committee consultation, visibility, staff input and current condition.


